COURSE OBJECTIVES

- Describe the evolution of the discipline of nursing in interprofessional cooperative group clinical trials.
- Describe the pathophysiology of sickle cell disease and the new treatment options currently being studied.
- Identify factors that contribute to the development of avascular necrosis (AVN) in children with hematologic or oncologic disorders and discuss treatment options for AVN.
- Describe the epidemiology of thrombosis and the risk factors of venous thromboembolism (VTE) in pediatric oncology.
- State the immunological classifications of acute lymphoblastic leukemia (ALL) and describe how immunotherapeutic agents affect their clones.

- State late effects associated with treatment for childhood cancer and implement practices designed to improve the quality of life in childhood cancer survivors.

- Discuss the role of Genomic Proteomic Spectrometry (GPS) testing.
- Recognize the neurologic symptoms associated with Diffuse Intrinsic Pontine Glioma (DIPG) and describe how molecular genetics of DIPG is leading to novel therapies.
- Define hemophilia inhibitors and discuss the impact of inhibitors on the clinical care of the hemophilia patient.
- Identify which solid tumors are treated with autologous stem cell transplant and their treatment pre and post autologous stem cell transplant.
- Describe the role of school reintegration within a comprehensive system of care for pediatric hematology oncology patients.
- Identify tools and activities that may improve the patient's ability to cope with challenging changes during the school re-entry phase.
- Describe the pathophysiology of immune thrombocytopenia purpura (ITP) and discuss treatment options for ITP and important teaching points for families of a child with ITP.
- Describe the tests commonly obtained during a bone marrow biopsy and aspiration.
- Review the distinct psychosocial issues that pertain to the adolescent and young adult (AYA) population and discuss the importance of and the methods for addressing these issues.
- Differentiate between the six dimensions of wellness and describe the difference between acute and chronic stress.
