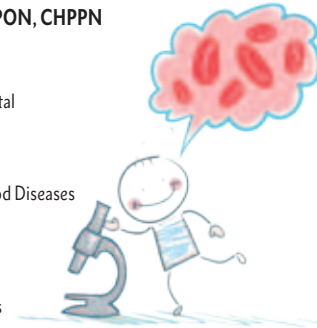

COURSE OBJECTIVES

- Discuss how past experience in pediatric oncology impacts current practice and how the role of a nurse can influence the development of treatment protocols.
- Describe the different types of chemotherapies available to treat T cell and Philadelphia chromosome positive acute lymphoblastic leukemia (ALL) and how to manage patients who are receiving this type of treatment.
- Describe risk factors for bloodstream infections related to mucosal barrier injury in children receiving stem cell transplantation or chimeric antigen receptor T cell therapy.
- Discuss the difference between intrinsic and extrinsic hemolytic anemias and the initial laboratory workup for hemolytic anemias.
- State the impact of cancer treatments on the long-term well-being of childhood and adolescent cancer survivors.
- Define moral distress and discuss potential interventions for dealing with moral distress.
- List examples of hematologic and oncologic diagnoses that would be appropriate for palliative care and describe the difference between palliative care and hospice care.
- Discuss the presentation and biology of neuroblastoma and new therapeutic strategies in neuroblastoma therapy.
- Describe Children's Oncology Group's (COG) updated risk classifications and definitions of remission and relapse in ALL.
- Discuss immunotherapy versus conventional chemotherapy in the treatment of ALL patients and identify new treatment strategies including immunotherapy for frontline treatment in ALL patients.
- Identify the components of implicit bias and describe two strategies to interrupt implicit bias.
- Describe challenges in adolescent and young adult (AYA) cancer clinical trial enrollment and list several current AYA cancer survival disparities.
- Describe the newer targeted therapies for brain tumors and their side effects.
- Verbalize understanding of the changing cytogenetic landscape of pediatric acute myeloid leukemia (AML) and current treatment and rising novel agents.
- Discuss new and novel therapies for the treatment of viral infections in immunocompromised patients.
